

A Look Back At Our Early Restivals:

In 1900 the first 'Musical Competition' was held in Brigg. This has evolved over the last 125 gears into the North Lincolnshire Music and Drama Festival that we know and love today. The Festival committee are fortunate to hold a vast archive dating from the first festival which, along with memoirs written by Lady Winefride Elwes, hold large amounts of information detailing its formation and history. Founded in 1900, Lady Winefride explains that the Elwes family aimed to set up 'village choral competitions... to improve the musical standard of our churches and chapels, and to encourage the formation of Choral Societies in towns and villages where they do not at present exist'. Despite doubters who said 'Lincolnshire was an unmusical county and Ethat they I should be sure to fail', Lady Winefride and Gervase Elwes, along with the original committee, patrons and working party created a festival to be proud of. Lady Winefride tells us that 'at once the musical competitions became an established feature in the life of our corner of North Lincolnshire'.

The Festival has always attracted famous names. Modern adjudicators find themselves in illustrious company when they add their signatures to the autograph book. Percy Grainger, the famous Australian pianist and composer, used the Festival as a base from which to collect Lincolnshire folk songs between 1903 and 1908. Music aficionados will also need no introduction to Thomas Dunhill, who adjudicated in 1928, Herbert Howells, 1930, or to Elizabeth Poston, 1957. The first ever adjudicator, WG McNaught in 1900, stated that he understood entrants 'will need every possible encouragement ... I am coming as a friendly teacher and certainly not as a censorious judge'. This atmosphere of friendly and fun competition is something that the current committee strives to uphold.

The Elwes family moved from Brigg to Northamptonshire in 1913, were sad to leave, but left the Music Festival as 'a permanent memorial to Etheir I happy years in Lincolnshire'. And so it remains. Bereavements, wars and pandemics have occasionally got in the way, but 123 years on from the first competition, the current committee are determined to see the North Lincolnshire Music and Drama Festival reaching far into the future.

An excellent performance, demonstrating fluent technical and artistic skills with emerging individuality

90-94 Outstanding

An impressive performance technically and artistically, displaying spontaneity & clear individuality

A superlative performance, displaying exceptional artistic individuality

Meet Our Adjudicators:

Music: Martin Wallington

Martin has now retired after 36 years as a viola player in the BBC Philharmonic. A graduate of Chetham's School Of Music and The Royal Northern College Of Music, he has enjoyed an exciting and fulfilling career playing in many of the finest concert halls in Europe, North and South America, China and Japan, as well as the BBC Proms and all the major concert venues in the UK.

Martin is hugely committed to his involvement in music education. He regularly advises senior students at the beginning of their professional career, and was for a number of years a Mentor for the BBC Philharmonic/RNCM Professional Access Scheme, where students spend time working alongside their mentor in the professional working environment. In addition to his playing commitments, he has always had a busy private teaching practice, as well as teaching for a number of years in the Music Department at Manchester University.

Martin has been increasingly in demand as an Adjudicator both at school music competitions and at festivals all over the UK. He loves encouraging young people on their 'journey' to discovering the joy of making live music.

Away from music, Martin is a fluent French speaker and loves 'escaping' to France on holiday. He is a keen walker and will often be found hiking around the Yorkshire Wolds where he now lives with his wife (a cello teacher), a demanding cat and 2 crazy dogs!

Drama: Julie McLoughlin

Julie trained at Rose Bruford College of Speech and Drama, worked in the professional theatre and has full Equity membership.

She has a BA Hons in English Literature and Education (OU) and taught for twenty years, first in Buckinghamshire where she was a Senior Moderator for CSE Drama and then in Jersey, where she set up A' Level Theatre Studies and GCSE Drama courses.

She has directed numerous school productions and is a Full Member of the Guild of Drama Adjudicators as well as an Adjudicator for The British and International Federation of Festivals. She teaches speech, drama, communication skills and public speaking to children and adults.

Rules Of The Restival

The North Lincolnshire Music & Drama Festival, (Hereinafter will be called "The Festival")

1. MANAGEMENT

The organisation and management of the festival shall be in the hands of a Management Committee appointed at the Annual General Meeting for that purpose, from members of the Society.

2. PERFORMANCES

- a) Our Festival is for amateurs. An amateur is someone who does not derive his/her livelihood from the branch of performance defined by the class title, in which he/she seeks to enter the Festival.
- b) No performer shall perform in more than one group in the same class.
- c) Conductors are forbidden to sing with their own choirs.
- d) Conducting is not allowed in solo singing classes.

3. ENTRIES

Entries will close on 15th January 2025. All must be made using the google form link on the front cover or via the website.

No performers tickets will be issued in respect of entry fee, the name of the performer appearing in the programme being sufficient evidence of payment.

We reserve the right to refuse late entries.

4. PRIZES

- a) The Management Committee reserves the right to withhold any of the prizes in the event of an insufficiency of entries of merit.
- b) **The Marking Standardisation Scheme** has been introduced by the Federation of Festivals. An explanation of this scheme can be seen on the inside of the front cover of the syllabus and on each mark sheet.
- c) Please note that where a trophy is awarded to a group of classes, the winners of those classes will take part in a "play off" during the Festival. The Trophies section towards the back of the syllabus indicates which classes are concerned in the "play offs". Please see the slip attached to your certificate.
- d) All trophies shall be returned to the Cup Secretary by the 1st of February in the year following the Festival in which they were awarded.

5. AGES

Where ages and not birthdates are stipulated the age of the performer on 31st August 2025 will apply.

6. TIMINGS

As it is impossible to foresee the number of withdrawals due to illness or for any other reason, the committee reserves the right to start daytime classes 15 minutes early.

7. USING PRINTED MATERIALS

Performers are reminded that it is illegal to photocopy (or copy by any other means) works which are copyright, without the permission of the copyright holder. The Festival and/or the adjudicator may refuse photocopied items where the performer cannot provide proof of permission to copy. Permission is never given when the item is published separately.

8. USE OF RECORDED MUSIC AT THE FESTIVAL

This Festival is affiliated to the British and International Federation of Festivals for Music, Speech and Dance and participates in its Group Licence to cover payment of fees for the use of recorded music at its events.

Teachers using tracks created from commercial recordings are advised that they should themselves seek permission to record from the record companies concerned, as the Festival cannot take responsibility for this.

9. TIMING

Performers are asked to note the time limits carefully. Setting up and performance times must be strictly adhered to, and if the performer goes over the stated time limit, the performance will be adjudicated but not marked. Timing begins after any introduction has been made.

10. PROTESTS

All protests must be in writing to the secretary prior to any trophies and awards being distributed.

11. PHOTOGRAPHY

Please note that the taking of photographs **BY ANY MEANS** and audio recording **is not permitted** at the Festival.

Festival approved Press Photographers may take photographs. If any parent/guardian objects to their child/ young person being photographed whilst attending the Festival. they must inform the festival secretary in advance, or the chief steward before the class/session commences.

Music Rules

Please note the dates by which music must be received by the entries secretary. In all own choice classes, a proportion of the marks awarded will be for suitability of choice at the standard for the class. The responsibility of choosing music rests with music teachers.

SET PIECES

Please note that for set pieces **THE SPECIFIED EDITION MUST BE USED** in order to avoid confusion with the accompanist when a different edition has been used by the performer.

THE ACCOMPANIST

The official accompanist must be used for all classes where the test piece is a set piece for ages 16 years and under.

If the official accompanist is required for other classes, please indicate on the entry form. Photocopies will not be accepted for use by the accompanist. Music teachers may discuss with the accompanist, relevant details, such as the speed at which a piece is played.

TIMING

If a performer goes over the stated time limit the performance will be adjudicated but not marked. **NO REPEATS** except Da Capo unless otherwise stated.

MUSIC PUBLISHERS ASSOCIATION (MPA)

We are pleased to announce that we are now a signatory to the MPA Code of Fair Practice (revised for 2012) agreed between Composers, Publishers and users of printed music. As such a specific permission has been granted regarding photocopying music as follows:

Adjudicator Copy. A person performing work at our Festivals in front of an adjudicator may make one copy for the adjudicator provided that the performer has already purchased his/her own copy and that the copy made is retained and destroyed by the adjudicator immediately after the Festival. The copy must be marked with the following "Adjudicator copy. Destroy after use"

IMPORTANT: This permission only applies to the Adjudicator copy and all other copies used for the performance (e.g. by the performer and/or accompanist) must be originals.

This only applies to the music publishers who have agreed to adhere to the standards set out in the MPA's Code of Fair Practice.

Songs from the Shows - Vocal entries

All performances using music from shows in current production are subject to copyright law. Songs from shows in current production may be sung as a concert item. i.e. with no costume or movement, without the need for copyright permission. Where movement or costumes are included in a performance, copyright permission is required and the Festival Committee accepts these entries on the basis that the appropriate copyright permission has been sought. Proof of this permission must be provided to the entries secretary.

Performers or teachers with queries on how to obtain copyright permission for performance items should contact Festivals House on 01625 428297 before making their entries.

Drama Rules

Where the terms "Primary" and "Secondary" are used to indicate age, this means that the performer should be of the appropriate age to be attending a Primary School or a Secondary School during the school year September to July but does not exclude individual and private entries.

For details of stage and arrangements for furniture etc. please contact the Festival committee. Copies of poems may be obtained from the Festival committee and Brigg Community Hub: The Angel.

In Quartet classes, one certificate only will be issued in respect of each group gaining an award. It is suggested therefore that groups enter using a composite title.

Additional certificates will be supplied upon request and upon payment of £1 each.

In duet classes two certificates will be issued.

Please note that in <u>PROSE SPEAKING CLASSES</u> the test piece is to be RECITED FROM MEMORY and not read.

Scripts for both junior and senior Duologue classes, and for all Group Drama classes must be provided for the adjudicator. (See date for submission on entry form) Failure to provide a script will mean exclusion from that class.

Please note that <u>CHORAL SPEAKING CLASSES</u> are Speech Classes Only and that no singing, music, or movement is allowed. It is a SPEECH CLASS.

In Class 1, Verse Speaking 4 years and under, and Classes 55, 56 and 56a, Choral Speaking Classes, in the event of many entries being received, these classes will be divided into separate sessions, each group being awarded a First and Second Prize and the highest mark will determine the trophy winner if applicable.

Drama classes marked ** may include makeup, costumes and props.

Poetry, Prose and Solo Monologue Performances

Author's Licensing and Collecting Society (ALCS)

Our group licence agreement with ALCS allows for:

Speech & Drama Festivals to include spoken performances of poetry and prose to a limit of 10 minutes duration.

Solo Dramatic items may also qualify for copyright indemnity provided that the item is announced with title and author at the time of the performance and the performer must not change the words or gender of the character.

Important: For Duologues and all other group dramatic works (including Musical Theatre) the onus on gaining copyright permission, and paying royalty fees due, should be placed onto the performer in the absence of any other licensing agreement.

Child Protection And Safeguarding Policy

The British and International Federation of Festivals for Music, Dance and Speech work for amateur festivals everywhere to help create thousands of educational performance opportunities for children and young people each year.

The Federation, and our member Festivals, are committed to ensuring safe environments for children and young people and believe that it is always unacceptable for a child or young person to experience abuse of any kind. We recognise our responsibility to safeguard the welfare of all children and young people, by a commitment to recommend best practice which protects them.

This policy applies to our Board of Trustees, paid staff, Adjudicator members, volunteers, students, or anyone working on behalf of the Federation and our member Festivals.

We recognise that:

- the welfare of the child/young person is paramount
- all children, regardless of age, disability, gender, racial heritage, religious belief, sexual orientation or identity, have the right to equal protection from all types of harm or abuse
- working in partnership with children, young people, their parents, carers, and other agencies is essential in promoting young people's welfare.

The purpose of the policy:

- to provide protection for the children and young people who participate in our festivals, including the children of festival members
- to provide staff and volunteers with guidance on procedures they should adopt in the
 event that they suspect a child or young person may be experiencing, or be at risk of,
 harm

We will seek to safeguard children and young people by:

- valuing them, listening to and respecting them
- adopting child protection guidelines through procedures and safe working practice for staff and volunteers
- recruiting staff and volunteers safely, ensuring all necessary checks are made
- sharing information about child protection and safe working practice with children, parents, staff and volunteers
- sharing information about concerns with agencies who need to know, and involving parents and children appropriately
- providing effective management for staff and volunteers through supervision, support and training.

The Federation will review this policy each year in November in line with Safe Network guidance or sooner in light of any changes in legislation or guidance. All changes will be communicated to our member Festivals in time for the start of the new Festival year.

Creating Safer Restivals for Everyone

The Federation and its member Festivals use the following policies and procedures to create Safer Festivals for everyone:

- 1. A single, definitive Child Protection Policy adopted by all Federation Festivals.
- 2. One or more designated Festival Safeguarding Officers (FSO) appointed for each Federation Festival.

- 3. Best practice advice in the form of Safe Working Practice and Festival Child Protection leaflets, with support and training for all Festival staff and volunteers. Including clear reporting procedures for anyone with a concern about a child.
- 4. Appropriate recruitment and induction procedures for all new Festival staff and volunteers responsible for providing safe environments for everyone attending / performing at a Federation Festival.
- 5. All Festival stewards wear an identity badge. All teachers/parents/guardians/carers are asked to report all incidents of any nature to anyone wearing a Festival identity badge. All reported incidents will be handled in accordance with the Safe Working Practice and Festival Child Protection best practice advice. In addition, we will ensure the availability of a quiet area / room where concerns can be expressed in private.
- 6. For the duration of the Festival all teachers/parents/guardians/carers are responsible for the continuous care and supervision of their own children/pupils/vulnerable adults. If they are unable to attend personally, they must delegate their responsibilities to an identified adult and ensure that their children/pupils/vulnerable adults are aware of the identity and name of the person responsible for their care. This includes supervision throughout all Festival venues, performance, practice and changing areas that may be provided.
- 7. No unauthorised photography, sound or video recording is allowed at our Festivals. Where parents/guardians/carers do not wish photos to be taken at all, then the responsible adult attending should ensure that their child/pupil/vulnerable adult is not included in official authorised photos.
- 8. Some children and vulnerable adults may have specific needs in order to take part. If this is the case, we ask the responsible teachers/parents/guardians/carers to contact the Festival prior to arrival. The Festival actively seeks wherever possible to meet these needs but must know beforehand in order to prepare support or to advise that help cannot be provided on this occasion.
- 9. The Festival's Child Protection Policy and approach to Creating Safer Festivals for Everyone is published explicitly in our Syllabus and Programme. By completing and signing the entry form all parents / guardians / carers and teachers of entrants under 18 (or vulnerable adults of any age) confirm that they give (or have obtained) the necessary consents for the entrants to take part in the Festival. Without consent the entry to the Festival cannot be accepted.
